Food is a kind of language that loads the nutritional act with multiple meanings.

This conference aims to analyze the *political* dimension of the language of food in two main ways: on the one hand, by considering food as a sign of belonging to a community – a *polis*; on the other hand, by taking into account the "discourses on food" and the actions undertaken by public authorities as a way to manage and define the relationship with citizens.

The conference concludes a National Research Project (PRIN) launched in 2015 by the University of Bologna in collaboration with the Universities of Palermo and Pollenzo. The project has involved scholars from various scientific fields, ranging between history, anthropology, semiotics, philosophy and art history.

These different yet complementary approaches have already led to important scientific meetings held at the three Universities.

This final event brings together specialists of international standing, highlighting the fertility and extraordinary potential of food history as a key to a global access to history.
